Vicar's Voice 25 February 2024

Greetings to you my brothers and sisters in Christ,

As I continue to recover from an awful hit of covid, I've been reflecting on the sideswipes of life we sometimes find ourselves in. Those things in life we were not expecting, and they have the potential to throw us off course. They certainly don't feel good, but through this time of Lent, as we take time to do some self-reflecting, I wonder, how do you respond to these sideswipes of life?

Last week we heard in the gospel reading from Mark about Jesus being led into the wilderness, and he had Satan tempting him with many different scenarios, that required Jesus to respond. In the great model that he is, Jesus shows up how he put his focus on the word of God, the provision of God, and the love of God. This last week I've certainly been thankful for the provision of God, through other people caring for me and stepping in to the places I could not be. I spent time in the word of God which constantly reminds me of God's greater story, and I took absolute comfort in the love of God, as I needed to rest well and not worry, putting my trust in the Lord.

So, let's go back to the question of self-reflection... How are you respond to sideswipes of life, those unexpected, uncomfortable, even painful things that try to throw you off course? It is my prayer that as we reflect over this time of Lent, that the Spirit of God will illuminate those areas of our lives where we take things into our own hands and fail to look to God. May it be a time of slowing down, reflecting on our responses to life, righting our wrongs, and relishing in the word of God, the provision of God, the love of God, and being reminded of God's greater story. He sent his beloved Son Jesus, to die for our transgression, that we might live abundantly through the equipping and empowering of His Holy Spirit.

As we each face our "getting back on track", refocusing on God, correcting our wrongs, throughout this season of Lent, may God's unfailing love enfold you, that we may strengthen individually and as a faith community.

I look forward to joining you on Sunday.

MISSION NEWS: Act For Peace is the international humanitarian agency of the National Council of Churches in Australia. It has raised over \$394,000 in its Gaza Emergency Appeal. The funds have been distributed by Act For Peace's partners the Near East Council of Churches (NECC) and Department of Service to Palestinian Refugees.

When the opportunities have arisen, the funds have been used to provide:

- * Hygiene and sanitary dignity kits. * Medical consultations and blood tests.
- * Cash assistance for urgent basic needs including food, water and winter clothing.

NECC staff have been working through the Rafah Clinic to provide primary healthcare services, with 30 health workers providing support to 400 patients each day. With the attacks on Rafah and the clinic, the immediate future of this ministry is uncertain.
