LOVE IS OUR HARVEST

Vicar's Voice. Greetings church,

As time flies by so quickly, we are well into our journey together, as Vicar and congregation, and we are well into the season of Lent. I've been encouraging you to spend some time this Lent to take stock of where your faith sits in relation to what's unfolding in your lives. How does your faith influence your path through life, the sideswipes and challenges, the joys and celebrations, where does God fit within these areas?

Within our Lenten study we are being presented with some stories of people who have processed through seasons of tragedy in their lives, and in hearing these stories, we are engaging with our own hurts and painful seasons that we all have encountered in different times. For some these times are taking place right now. Many who have been attending the study are finding the discussion with others insightful, and helpful in the processing of such pain.

You may be thinking, why on earth do we want to be spending time looking at and discussing such painful and challenging times of life? My response to that is on two levels, firstly as we prepare and journey toward Easter, it is a good spiritual practice to delve deeply into the pain, challenge and ugliness of our Lord Jesus' crucifixion. When we allow ourselves to truly enter this traumatic story, we gain a greater understanding of what Jesus went through, for MY sake, what Jesus went through for YOUR sake, what He went through for the sake of the world. He gave his life, and it was painful, challenging, and ugly. Yet we know on the other side of His death, the power of the Holy Spirit raised Him to life eternal.

Secondly, it is in Christ's crucifixion that we gain a model and understanding of how we too can process through our own pain and challenges, so that new life may abound. My own story bears witness of this; therefore, I know personally that it is possible, and I know that is it God's desire that we process through these painful times, not shoving them down deep in our core, instead facing and dealing with them in order to be released into new life. It is good to remember that Jesus understands our pain and is compassionately with us through these times and the same Spirit that rose Jesus from the dead, is the same Spirit that empowers us into new life.

We were encouraged through this week's study to find purpose out of our pain, and in spite of our pain, that we may bring Glory to God. Saying all of this, I do understand that some of you may be feeling very uncomfortable, as it may be a

foreign practice for you. Please know I am available to speak with. I'm open to you sharing your discomfort with me, know that you don't have process this journey alone.

I'm really proud of how many of you have chosen to engage in this space, and I'm excited to see all that God is doing in the life of this faith community. You are all in my prayers, stay strong in faith and give thanks to God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit for the blessings being bestowed upon us all at this time.

MISSION NEWS Churches are always looking for innovative ways to engage people in considering the good News of Jesus.

At Lightning Ridge, the Bush Church Aid (BCA) missionaries - Kurt and Bec Langmead have formed a "Bible Disco" group (short for Bible Discovery Group).

It centres around Bible storytelling:

- * The group sits in a circle and a Bible story is told.
- * Then the group retells the story.
- * After that they play Bible Disco, which is run like a gameshow - questions are asked and it can get a bit competitive.

Most of the group are men and unbelievers who live 'off the grid in' camps.

10-15 attend Bible Disco and 15-30 come for the dinner that follows.

These people now know that the Christian faith is not just religion but a story they are part of.

Kurt and Bec are now searching for the next step to see these people come into a personal relationship with the Lord Jesus.

Please pray for wisdom for them and the Lightning Ridge Community Church congregation, as they look to see Bible Disco members take the next step.
