Vicar's Voice...Greetings to you all in the name of Christ Jesus, our Saviour.

## Why? How?

Why should I participate in the season that we know as Lent? Why should I self-examine? How does it make any difference to my life? Why am I suffering? How am I going to get through this? Why, why, why, how, how, how?

The questions of 'why and how" can often be seen as negative questions, and they can hold great pain and angst, especially when they come to us amidst challenging times, or when these questions lead us to a crossway of change within ourselves, or the need for change within our circumstances. Yet these are the questions Jesus himself often asked. Around 80 of the questions Jesus asked (and He asked a lot of questions) are "how" and "why" questions. One of Jesus' most powerful questions was asked as he suffered on the cross, "Eloi, Eloi, lema sabachthani?" which means "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?"

It is extremely hard when we struggle to find the answers to such questions, however, it is important to be asking them, as it allows us to seek new information about ourselves, about others and most importantly about God. Jesus shows us what it means to live fully under the will of God, the Father, yet we often bypass God's will to ensure our own ways remain secure. However, from my experience God's ways are always better, not always easy but always better, and as we trust Him we can gain great strength, comfort and endurance as we share in the power and hope in God, even through difficult times.

Therefore, as we continue to journey through this time of Lent, I'm offering the following prayer which may help you as you ask questions, self-examine, and seek God in your every day.

Afresh I seek you this day O Lord, lead me once more I pray, If ever it should be against my will, my way, let me not feel your absence this day,

or shrink from you as an estranged power.

Through doubt, through faith, through bliss, through stark dismay, through sunshine, wind, rain or storm, draw me ever closer to You, my one true hope and life everlasting.

MISSION \_The Leprosy Mission (TLM) is having a special Easter Appeal for victims of Leprosy in Nigeria.

According to TLM leprosy remains out of control in Nigeria, and in Zamfara State a new case is reported every 35 hours.

The story of Jane is typical of many in Nigeria. When her father died from leprosy complications, her extended family turned up and tried to marry her off and force her 2 younger brothers to become farm labourers.

TLM Nigeria rescued the family and sent the children back to school.

Jane is now married and has a Master's Degree in Public Health. The brothers are at university studying electrical engineering and computer science.

Lives have been transformed through the work of the TLM.

The great news is that every dollar donated by TLM supporters for work in Nigeria, is matched by a 5:1 grant from the Australian Government through Australian Aid. In other words, every \$1 we donate means \$6 goes to TLM.

This grant from Australian Aid is in operation from now until **28th March**.
