

VICAR'S VOICE... Greetings in the name of Jesus Christ,

As our Lenten journey comes to an end and as we enter Holy week, I pray that your personal reflections and self-examination has been rich with insight, challenge, and spiritual growth. I have been so blessed to have witnessed the journey of around 40 of our parishioners, as together we have engaged deeply with the Lenten Study, 'Unanswered Prayer' which was on offer this year. It has been a profound and powerful time as we've looked deeply into the painful journey Jesus undertook with obedience, and we have aligned our own stories of pain and brokenness, reflecting on how our faith in God can carry us through, even when we 'feel' that God is silent. We've learnt more about ourselves, about others and more importantly gained a deeper understanding for God as we've shared and reflected together. In being vulnerable, raw, and authentic we've gained strength. From delving deeper into our life's challenges, rather than supressing them or glossing over them, we've recognised how God uses such times in our lives to bring us to new life, with a deeper spiritual connection to Himself.

So, with this said, I encourage you to take time through this Holy week and Easter season to reflect and remember the crucifixion of Jesus. May it be a time in which we truly recognise Jesus' obedience to the Father's will. As we face the challenges and horror that enfolded Jesus and engage with the entire story of his crucifixion and resurrection, may we come to know that this event took place out of God's love for YOU. Where life was lost, new life was gained, and this is a precious gift to us all. May we not gloss over any portion of what Jesus went through, but rather feel deeply the loss of his life, in order that we can celebrate His resurrection, new life after death and the hope of life eternal.

After the Lenten study was completed this week, many people were asking me, "what's next?" I believe the Spirit of God has been stirring, since my arrival and I do believe God is moving us swiftly along the path of new life for this parish, so I am keen that after Easter (& after I've had some down time to rest) I will be looking at calling a parish meeting or two. A space where I will facilitate a chance for us to sharing together on where we are as a parish and where we believe God is leading us. Looking practically at our ministries, our worship services and reimagining the future of parish life, as we partner with God in building a strong and thriving faith community that is growing as it engages with the wider community. In other words, fulfilling our mission statement "to know Christ and to make Christ known". I do ask for your prayers as I prepare to lead this time ahead and keep an eye out for how you can be involved. I would really like to hear from the many voices throughout the parish, so that together we can discern God's will for this faith community, the body of Christ.

My prayers are with you, have a blessed week, as we worship and give thanks to God for the gift of life and love. Yours in Christ, Vicar Liz.
