VICAR'S VOICE Well hello to you all! What an incredible time we find ourselves. A time where God appears to be calling people to himself, to come to know him, whether for the first time in their lives, or a time to know more of God. All of which aligns with us, as a parish, being in a time of 'reimagining the future' and what it may look like for us as a faith community moving forward. It has been so insightful for me to hear the thoughts, challenges and hopes of many of you through the recent survey, and these insights have been used to frame our time together this **Sunday, 28th April 2.30pm at St Peter's**, as we gather for conversations, seeking God's lead forward for us as a parish.

As your leader, I am encouraged to see people reaching beyond the challenges we face, and seeking to explore the hopes we have available to us. We were reminded last week of Jesus being our shepherd, and it is Jesus that walks ahead of us, guiding, protecting, and providing all our needs. And, as we edge toward Pentecost, we are reminded that we are not to do anything in our own strength, but rather partner with the Holy Spirit, who equips, empowers, and helps us to fulfil all that God is calling us to. It is my prayer that you may all step into this space, as we explore together the more that God has for us as a faith community.

I understand that some of you may be feeling that you are not able to; 'do' anything, be a part of the conversations or able to put your hand up to join ministry teams, due to mobility issues, struggling health, or purely because you are tired. If this is you, can I encourage you, one of the most important roles of this time is prayer. Praying for God's wisdom, his strength and guidance are the prayers which will form the backbone for us moving forward, and anyone of you can be a part of that. Everyone has a role to play in God's kingdom, if you so choose.

For others of you, who are able, I encourage you to think and pray about the role God might like you to play in us moving forward. Perhaps you've been a member of this parish for many years but haven't really stepped forward into any roles. You might feel that you don't have any gifts to share, or you're not confident to step forward. Can I encourage you all, God has many roles within the church, and has something for all of us, and I'd be happy to spend time with you exploring what this might mean for you personally. Let us remember what scripture tells us... *'There are different kinds of gifts, but the same Spirit. There are different kinds of service, but the same Lord. There are different kinds of working, but the same God works all of them in his people".*

1 Corinthians 12: 4-6 "For the body is a unit, though it is made up of many parts: and though all its parts are many, they form one body." 1 Corinthians 12:12

I'm excited and expectant for great things of God ahead. This doesn't mean it will be without challenge, but together as the body of Christ let us step into where God is calling us, with faith, trust and our eyes fixed on God, Father, Son & Holy Spirit.

Barnabas Aid is an international organization whose aim is to do everything it can to support persecuted Christians.

One of its current projects is a petition to "End the Genocide of African Christians".

The petition requests that the long-running, large scale anti-Christian violence in Africa be discussed at the Commonwealth Heads of Government Meeting in Samoa in October.

The aim is to see how Commonwealth governments can work alongside African governments to equip and empower them to bring peace, stability and freedom from violence for Christians and other vulnerable communities.

The aim and prayer is that as many signatures as possible be gathered and sent to that meeting in October. Please make that a prayer point in your regular prayers.
