MISSION NEWS

Twenty first century Missionaries take professional skills into their settings to enable them to provide practical help to the people they serve, as well as opening doors to share The Good News.

M and K are serving in South Asia, where M works as a consultant to an NGO which provides support in urban sanitation and waste management. M writes that 2000 years ago, sinners and tax collectors were the outcasts of society. In modern-day South Asia, the septic tank emptiers and waste workers are the social outcasts.

M is working with them to increase their livelihoods and dignity, and provide innovative, safer and cleaner ways of performing this essential service. He has the opportunity to "sit with these men and women and show that he deeply cares about them; to speak to them in their language; to shake their hands; to hold their newborn babies and drink tea with them." For M, this is kingdom work as he shows the love of God in action. Sometimes, when M has office work, K has the opportunity to meet with an elderly lady to read the Bible and pray together. This is also kingdom work.

Jesus washed the feet of the outcast and laid hands on the lepers - M and K are using their skills to do the same in a modern context.

They have asked us to: give thanks for the sanitation workers of South Asia.

: pray that the people M works with may see Christ's love in his care for them and their environment.

: pray that K's friend may continue to be encouraged as they meet to read the Bible and pray together.

M and K are Australians working for an Australian Anglican mission agency.

To those parishioners who have mission bottles, the first **o**pening for 2024 will be on Sundays 14 and 21 April. As usual, buckets will be available at each church, at each of the services. Please bring your bottle, empty it into the bucket, and take it home and start again. The second opening will be in August.
