VICAR'S VOICE

Greetings in the name of Jesus,

As we continue with our second week of reflecting on the habits of highly missional people, I wonder if anyone has a story to share this week about how they tried to live a questionable life? You see, we can reflect, we can study, we can 'know' all about characteristics of Jesus and His teachings, yet it's not until we explore them in action that they fully come to a place of true knowing. These habits are not a one off, we'll give it a go and then forget about it, these are habits in our character which we'll find regular rhythm in, regular ways of being, transforming our now into what we will be (more like Jesus), and becoming our lifestyle.

Another way of putting it is, we want to link our (inner) spirituality and our (outward) actions, working them together and showing a powerful expression of our faith. The book of James puts it like this, "Show me your faith without deeds, and I will show you my faith by my deeds". (James 2:18) Our actions of faith are the developments of our discipleship, and these learnings can be seen in so many creative, intentional and simple ways.

In this week's Sunday message, we'll be exploring the first two suggested habits of 'blessing' and 'eating'. Who doesn't love to eat !But we need to remember, these habits are not just for the sake of a practical exercise that the Vicar gives their congregation. 'Missional Habits' are fostered in our lives in order that, in all we do and say, others are alerted to the reign of God, through Christ Jesus. They are fostered so the Kingdom of God might be seen on earth. For when We are alerted to the reign of God, our lives are transformed for good. As we receive the love of God for ourselves, we then get the opportunity to pass on the love of God to those around us, to our families, friends, small groups, communities, and in turn all are impacted and transformed for good by the love of God. (Remember the line in the Lord's prayer? We pray it each week. Let your Kingdom come, let your will be done, here on earth as it is in heaven.")

I'd love to hear from those of you who are stepping in to these invitations of exploring new faith habits. What are you trying? Do you have a good outcome story? Have you hit a challenge that you're finding difficult? You're not alone in this, it is my prayer, that together we develop new habits and become a stronger missional faith community that knows *Christ and makes Christ known*, bringing glory to God in who we are and how we live.

A prayer to enhance us through this time...

God of mission, who alone brings growth to your Church, send your Holy Spirit to give Vision to our planning, Wisdom to our actions, Joy to our worship, and Power to our witness. Help our church to grow in numbers, in spiritual commitment to you, and in service to our local community, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

I look forward to the journey ahead with you and continue to pray that together we may grow in the love of God, one for another.

To celebrate the 150th, on Friday there will be a Thanksgiving Service & Gala Dinner. Guest speakers will include Nikita Sarah, Head of Advocacy and Communication at The Leprosy Mission Trust, India; and Prof. Warwick Britton AO, Head of TB Research Program, Centenary Institute.

Those attending will hear about new advancements in leprosy treatment and will be warned that "leprosy is still a thing ".
