VICAR'S VOICE

Greetings my brothers and sisters in Christ,

I've just come back from having a coffee with someone who reached out to me via email because they'd heard of the 'Kingdom' work that I'm engaged in. Two different people had mentioned my name to this person and encouraged them to contact me. At first, I thought it a little strange, however I took up the invitation to meet with them. What took place was an hour and a half of sharing our faith journey's and both of us recognising that God is up to something, we're not fully sure what it is, however as we shared our stories it was apparent that God was there in our midst. This is not the first encounter I've had like this, recently there have been many.

Why do I mention this to you? Well on Sunday we are going to be spending time within our services sharing and listening to story, as I interview some of the participants of our recent Alpha course. What has God been up to within people, as they've listened to the teachings of Alpha, had conversations with others around table and been challenged in their faith. It's important for us to be sharing story and listening to others, as this is how God can take us deeper in our own faith. As we engage and identify with what's happening within other people, we can feel more confident in our own journey, as continue to grow in Christ.

The Gospels are full of 'shared stories', and they help us to learn how to recognise God in our ordinary lives. So often I feel that Christian faith can be seen to be separate to our daily lives. What I mean by that is, we can put some specific time aside in our day or week for 'God stuff' yet often forget that He desires to be with us through every moment, every situation, every decision to be made and even in our general conversations. Imagine what life could be like if we were to live as though God was a part of our every moment. How different would our train of thoughts be? How different would our daily routines look?

Perhaps God is calling us to be sharing more stories, that we might recognise Him in our daily living, and begin to clearly see what He is calling us to within this time in history, within this town, within this parish. So, I encourage you, over this coming time to be intentional about sharing stories. What is God up to in your life? Can you recognise Him? What is He doing in the lives of those around you? May we begin to wonder, explore and be fascinated enough to go beyond what we already know of God, that He might reveal even more of Himself to us at this time. Food for thought!

MISSION NEWS The Bible League has a special interest in prison ministry. In Australia there are currently more than 40,000 prisoners in custody.

During February-March the Bible League ran a campaign called "Bringing hope Behind Bars", in partnership with 14 Christian radio stations across Australia.

This was to meet the annual need for 6,000-8500 Bibles.

Across the world, in the last year, Bible League:

- * reached 1.2 million children with Bible resources.
- * Trained 2,945 new church planters.
- * Planted more than 2.1 million Bible and Biblical resources in the persecuted church. Bible League Australia also has a ministry to the under-resourced Church in indigenous communities, in partnership with Vision Christian Radio.

As one person wrote, "some indigenous communities don't have churches, so to them to have a Bible is gold..."
