## **Mission News:**

Scripture Union works across Australia with children and youth.

At this time of the year, it is gearing up for all the January programs it conducts, especially in coastal areas like ours. Each January SU runs a children's program and a Theos program for teenagers in Barwon Heads. They have been a regular highlight for many young people over the years - both Bellarine locals and families of campers.

This year, SU experimented with a special program in Port Fairy, during the Folk Festival. Called the Port Fairy Folkie Theos Mission, it provided a safe space for young people to hang out.

Another new program is the Emerge program, designed to impact the lives of 15-25 year olds. The aim is to grow a "visionary, caring and courageous new generation of young Christian leaders". There are 10 pilot projects in schools across Australia, from Alice Springs to Tasmania and Darwin.
