VICAR'S VOICE

Greetings to you my brothers and sisters in Christ,

Can you believe that we are almost into our last quarter of the year? It feels like so much has happened yet there's still so much more to come. This week I've been working on some of the more strategic preparations for the coming seasons, whilst continuing with the here and now. Often there's a tension in holding different seasons at the same time, yet for me it continues to feel like God is paving the way forward and things are falling into place just when and where they are meant to.

I am, however, also conscious this week that we have quite a few parishioners who are unwell, with another wave of covid going through our community and others with more serious health matters they are dealing with. For each of you I pray, "Lord God, uphold Your people through these difficult times, give them strength in their weakness, peace in the concerns and wisdom in their decision making. Wherever they find themselves, may Your presence O Lord be tangibly felt by each of them." Amen.

In last Sunday's service we began to look at the letter of James and will continue this over the coming weeks. I mentioned that the letter of James was one of the earliest letters written to the first Jewish-Christians (possibly within a decade or two of Jesus death and resurrection). James opens his letter giving his audience clear illustrations of what it means to live with faith. "Be doers of the word, and not merely hearers who deceive themselves." He then goes on to share a warning on how Christians are to act, not aligning with favouritism of the rich over the poor, but rather treating everyone with mercy and honour. I shared some personal stories also and illustrated how we can take heed of what James had written, while also considering what personal characteristics we have developed as followers of Jesus. Just like the first Christians, it is not enough for us to treat some people well, while treating others with inappropriate high emotions or with disregard. I am constantly, as I shared, needing to 'put my Jesus on', for it's His character and His character alone that we need to be living out of.

This week we'll be continuing to dig deeper on what it means to show our faith in God by the way we live. James talks about faith and works and states, "faith is dead without works". That is a big statement, one which I agree with, but I wonder if at times Christians may have skewed the meaning of this, leaving us feeling either guilty, exhausted or completely lost to faith. It is my prayer that God speaks to us clearly through our reading of James' letter at this time and allows us to be renewed in our understanding of faith, growing and becoming more like Jesus for the world in which we live right now.

I look forward to exploring more of this with you all over the coming weeks and I continue to pray for you on this pilgrim journey.
