Vicar's Voice

Greetings to you my brothers and sisters in Christ,

What an incredible time we find ourselves in, with so much to be thankful to God for. I've been working with someone recently and I've been sharing with them the power of gratitude. As I reflect on this myself, I'm overwhelmed with the number of things I can be grateful for. I am so grateful for these last 8 months journeying with you all for starters! Wow, to see the hand of God at work in us, as individuals and as a faith community has brought me such joy and delight. God is AMAZING!
