VICAR'S VOICE From Edwin

It is a privilege to serve you in Liz's absence. In Liz our Father has blessed us with a pastor who cares for us and longs for God's best for our lives and for our church. We look forward to Liz and Tilly's safe return. Meanwhile Jill, John and I will do our best.

Let me share with you from my favourite Psalm 139 verse 12 ...

"even darkness is not dark for you, and the night is as bright as the day. Darkness and light are the same to you."

Over the next couple of weeks our readings from the Gospel of Mark take us on a journey with Jesus as he is focused on going to Jerusalem. A dark cloud hovers over Jesus. For you and me too, in our lives, there can be seasons of anxiety as we face situations which are dark and distressing leaving us bewildered about what is happening to us or those we love. We may be filled with foreboding, even afraid. As we observe Jesus embracing a gathering darkness, and his disciples trying to cope, we can learn more about our Lord Jesus, who he is, and who we are as his followers - even in the darkest of times.

Jesus had amazed people. There were his miracles like giving sight to a blind man. The people saw things that they had never seen before. Then there was his teaching which drew so many to him and left his critics dumbfounded. Jesus was on a roll and people were following him. What heady days it must have been for his closest followers. Imagine being there right in the centre of all the action. They were truly wonderful days.

But then it all began to turn. There was a darkness coming. Jesus had been talking about Jerusalem, and being shamed, tried like a criminal and killed. What had got into Jesus? What was happening to Jesus? Why was he now getting it all wrong? Jesus was so focussed on his future in Jerusalem that he was literally striding ahead of his followers on the road. Mark recorded the scene. "Jesus was going ahead of the disciples, who were filled with alarm; the people who followed behind were afraid." How did Jesus respond to their fear and alarm? He just doubled down on his dark rhetoric about Jerusalem, suffering and death.

What can you do when the one you follow now seems to be getting it wrong? When everything is turning dark, and your world is imploding.

This can be our experience and our deep frustration when even our Lord, whom we trust, seems to have turned our light into the darkness. The darkness of an impossible situation, a deep unending hurt, a disabling illness, a financial crisis or even our looming death or the death of someone we love.

How can we follow Jesus in that kind darkness?
